

4N40: Young families, limited means in terraced metropolitan areas

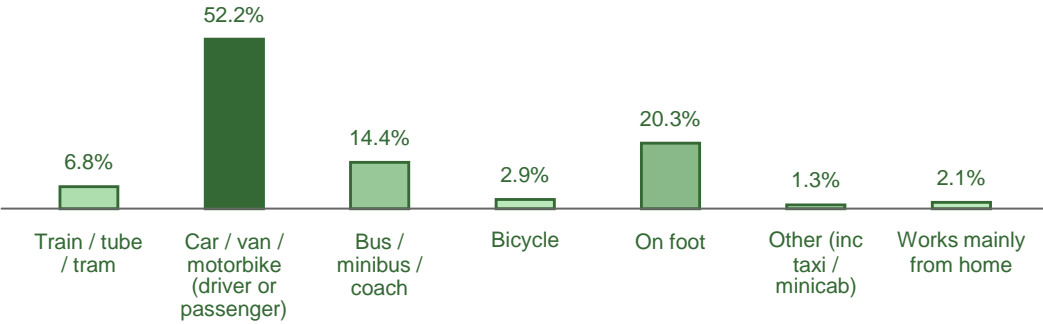


Road Safety Insight

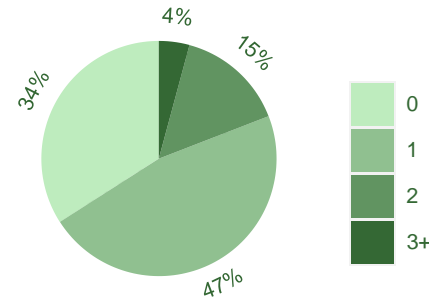
There are several key behavioural characteristics of this Acorn Type (4N40) which provide intelligence to target the road safety issues which affect them. This intelligence should be read as informative information relating to how those from communities of Type 4N40 interact with the road transport system, informing intervention designs and strategies to mitigate their injuries as casualties and their collision involvement levels locally.

The main car of those belonging to this Type is privately owned at 65%.

The owned car is usually a hatchback car (32%), or to a lesser extent either a saloon (20%) or an estate car (3%).

Whilst the household's main car was most likely bought used (52%), it is unlikely to be less than 3 years old (10%).

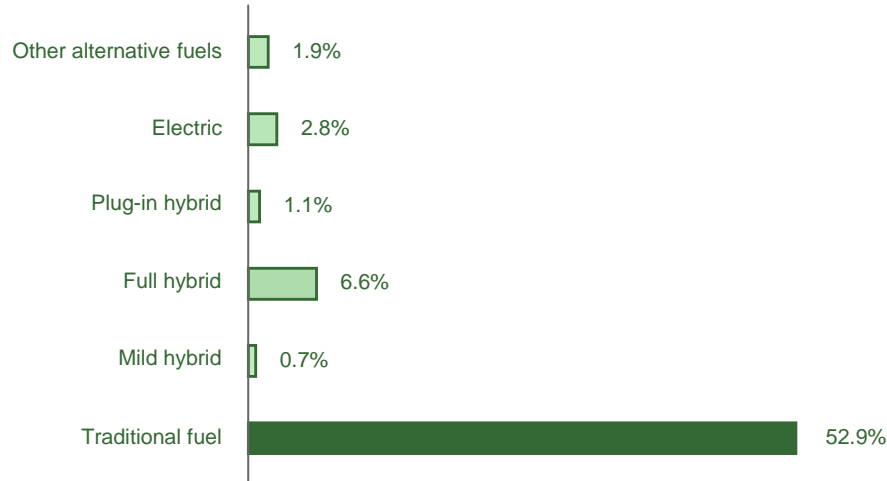
